# THE CAMDEN (FIRST) BAPTIST CHURCH Camden, South Carolina

### MINUTES OF CHURCH CONFERENCES 1810-1838

Transcribed and annotated by Joan Inabinet in preparation for the writing of <u>His People: A History of the Camden (First) Baptist Church</u> (1985). The original minute book is being stored at Furman University in the South Carolina Baptist Historical Collection. Microfilm copies of this minute book and other early church records are available at Furman, the South Caroliniana Library, and the Camden Archives. This typescript is being donated to the Camden Archives by Joan Inabinet.

The transcribed minutes are all from the first minute book volume, in the order of entry as found, with this exception: for convenience membership rolls have been placed at the beginning. Originally the list of white members followed the covenant which was placed at the front of the book; the list of Negro members was placed at the back of the book. His People devotes much attention to individual early members.

#### EXPLANATIONS FOR USING LIST OF NAMES OF MEMBERS

The formal listing of white members begins on the same page on which the Covenant ends. Including that page, the listing covers six pages in the mss. From page to page, columnar headings remain approximately the same except that beginning on the 5th page a column was added for "Restored" status. In transcribing, I have maintained on all columns of my pages the abbreviations used on the first mss. page of membership and have consistently omitted the "Restored" column since it was so rarely used. (Any information given has been noted on the list, however.) If information over-running a column might affect interpretation, I have indicated its original position as closely as possible with the typing.

Membership lists for white members and for black members (the latter list was kept at the end of the minute book) both contain many "X" marks, but I believe them to be not uniformly signature marks but rather indications of later clerical accounting. Therefore, in transcribing, I have omitted all such random markings. When names were struck out, I included the name and a notation [struck out].

All comments in square brackets are my interpolations.

The number beside each entry of the name of a member has been added by me for convenience of reference and does not appear in any form on the original mss. There are 163 entries, but perhaps some half-dozen or so persons are named more than once. (For example, there are three John Smiths who may or may not be the same person, plus one John Smith Jun.)

The notes which follow utilize for easy reference the number beside a member's name and cross reference other entries which may indicate the same member.

## EXPLANATIONS FOR USING LIST OF NAMES OF NEGRO MEMBERS

The formal listing of Negro members covers six pages in the mss. At the end of the back. From page to page, columnar headings remain approximately the same except that beginning on the 5th page a column was added for "Restored" status. (Such information had previously been noted in some other column or space.) In transcribing, I have maintained on all columns of my pages the abbreviations used on the first mss. page of Negro members, except that I have added consistently the "Restored" column to all my pages and placed such information there. If information overrunning a column might affect interpretation, I have indicated its position as closely as possible with the typing.

The number beside each entry of the name of a Negro member has been added by me for convenience of reference and does <u>not</u> appear in any form on the original mss. There are 180 entries, but apparently 126 individual persons.

Apparently at the end of 1828, someone saw the need to update the original list of Negro members which included numerous strike-outs and variant spellings. Thus the name <u>Celia</u> (number 77) begins a list which transfers and updates information about Negroes who were then (c. 1829) still members. The name <u>Phill</u> (number 126) is the last of the names recopied. The list continues with members accepted in 1829.

The cross-reference key on the following page indicates Negro members who appear to be the same. Change of ownership, church status, variant names can be noted. Omissions indicate members who were deceased or who had been dismissed or excluded by 1829.

THE SOLEMN COVENANT

of the

BAPTIST CHURCH, IN CAMDEN,

S.C.

Whereas it is the incumbent Duty of those who are favored with the dispensation of the Gospel, to embrace God's Covenant, acknowledge his government, profess his name, and unite together in the faith and fellowship of the Gospel:--We, whose names are here unto annexed, do now, as in the presence of the Great Eternal God, who knows the secrets of all hearts, and in the presence of Angels and Men, acknowledge ourselves under the most solemn obligations to be the Lord's; and we do solemnly covenant and agree:--

1<sup>st</sup> That we will take the only living and true God; One God in Three Persons; The Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, to be our God.\_\_
2<sup>nd</sup> We unreservedly and solemnly give up ourselves, and all we possess, to Almighty God; to be ordered, directed, and disposed of by him, according to the Council of his holy Will.—And this we do, in an humble dependence on the Grace of the Holy Spirit to aid and support us in these sacred engagements; hoping for acceptance and Salvation, thro' the merit and mediation of our Lord Jesus Christ.

← 3<sup>d</sup> We take the Scriptures of the Old and New Testament, to be our rule of faith and practice, in the Great Concerns of religion, and for a directory in the general affairs of life; and particularly for transacting the affairs of the church.--

We promise to maintain communion and fellowship with each other, in the public worship of God, according to the various Ordinances of the Gospel; "Not forsaking the assembling ourselves together, as the manner of some is," but embracing all regular and convenient seasons for this purpose, as the Providence of God shall permit: And that we will exercise Christian forbearance and love, one toward another; praying for, and sympathizing with each other, in the various circumstances of life, and using every laudable endeavor to provoke to love and good works.--

5<sup>th</sup> We promise, individually, to pay a respectful regard to the advice and admonitions of the Church, and to be subject to its discipline, as directed by the word of God and as conducted in the Spirit of the Gospel.--

6<sup>th</sup> We promise to contribute, in a reasonable manner, according to our ability, for the support of public worship, and the relief of the poor in the Church; and to use our influence, to forward and promote, the Interests of the Redeemer's Kingdom in the world.

That we will be careful to conduct ourselves with uprighness [sic] and integrity, and in a peaceful and friendly manner, toward mankind in general, and towards serious Christians, of all descriptions in particular; -- That we will pay a conscientious regard to Civil Government, and give it our support, as an Ordinance of God.--

And this Covenant we make, with the free and full consent of our Souls, hoping thro' rich, free and boundless Grace, we shall therein be accepted of God, unto eternal life, thro Jesus Christ our Lord:

To whom be glory and majesty, power and Domion [sic], everlasting--

  4<sup>th</sup> Also, agreed to hold our quarterly meetings on the second Sabbath in November, February, May and August, in every year following; The Saturday preceding to be employed in attending to a Sermon preparatory to the Administration of the Ordinance of the Gospel; in hearing the Experience of Candidates for Baptism, should there be any, and such other Duties as the church may think proper to be engaged in.—

5<sup>th</sup> Agreed to petition for admission into the Charleston Baptist Association. Requested Brother, Rev. Jos. B. Cook, to draw up the Petition and, when drawn up, to present it to the Church for their adoption & signature.--

Agreeably to the foregoing resolve of the Church Rev. Bro. Cook drew up the following Petition, which, being read before the Church, was accepted & signed,

Viz.

The Baptist Church, in Camden, S. C. to the Charleston Baptist Association, to be holden at the Ebenezer Church, Jeffries Creek,

The Saturday before the 1st Lord's Day in Nov. 1810.

Beloved Brethren/

Christ, by being regularly constituted on the 20<sup>th</sup> August last, by our beloved Brethren, Rev. Mess. John M. Roberts, Davis Collins, William B. Johnson & J. B. Cook; --We beg leave to present this our Petition, praying for admission into your respectable body. -The Brethren, who assisted at our Constitution, will inform you, if required, respecting our Faith and Order.--At the time of our Constitution we were in number.--Since then one of our Brethren has been dismissed, he being about to remove to the Western Country. Another, the Son of our venerable Deacon, Bro William Cook, has, we have abundant reason to believe, exchanged the Church militant fo[r] the Church triumphant in Heaven.--He was a Young Man of great promise both in the Church and in Society generally.--

October 13.th 1810--There was no Church meeting this day, Rev. Bro. Cook being absent at the quarterly meeting of the Baptist Church in Columbia, S. C. & the rest of the Brethren being also absent.--

Nov. 10<sup>th</sup> 1810. This being the return of our Quarterly Meeting, Rev. Brother Cook delivered a Discourse, preparatory to the Solemnities of the Season, from John "Ye are my Friends if ye do whatsoever I command you." The Brethren having neglected to attend the meeting, for business, nothing was transacted.—

Sunday morning—Nov. 11<sup>th</sup> 1810—Bro. W. B. Johnson, from Columbia, preached from Isa: 40 Chapter & 1.\* Verse—"Comfort ye, Comfort ye, my People, saith your God."—

In the afternoon the Lord's Supper was administered, by Bro. Cook, to a few Communicants.

In the Evening Brother Johnson lectured .--

January 12.<sup>th</sup> 1811 The Church convened for business. Present, Rev. Bro. Cook-W. Cook, Deacon, Thomas Green-John Campbell-Sam. Nettles, Brother Howel, from the Church at Flat Rock-and several Sisters.-
1. Rev. Bro. Cook commenced with Prayer.-
2. Brother Brazington presented a letter of dismission, from the Church at the High Hills of Santee, for himself and wife, requesting to be recd by us: But, as some of the Members, both in this and the Church at Flat Rock, had expressed some dissatisfaction with some recent conduct of Brazington: Therefore, resolved that Bro. Brazington be requested to return his letter of dismission to the

High Hills Church, in order than an inquiry be made respecting his conduct, and obtain a new letter from his Church expressive of their fellowship with him; upon the reception of which Letter we agree to receive him.—Sister Brazington was cordially received.—

3. In order that the Black Members should be kept under proper Discipline, appointed old Frank to examine them, occasionally, and to exhort and pray with and for them.—

Dismissed with Prayer .--

April 13.<sup>th</sup> 1811--The Church convened for business--Present, W.<sup>m</sup> Cook and Richard Stratford, Deacons, Thomas Green & 4 Sisters.-1.<sup>st</sup> Commenced with prayer.--

<sup>2&</sup>lt;sup>nd</sup> Agreed to deal with a Member who shall neglect to attend three Church Meetings, successively, without a proper excuse.--

<sup>3.</sup> The Brethren & Sisters are requested not to attend the preaching of William Brazington until he obtains fellowship with the members of the Flat Rock Church, with the High Hills Church and our own.-4. Brother Green requested a letter of dismission for himself & Sister Green, to join the Church at the Congaree; which he obtained.

May 11<sup>th</sup> 1811--The Church met this Day.--Present 10 Members.--The only business, this day transacted, was to set apart the 8<sup>th</sup> June next, as a day of fasting & prayer, to seek direction of the Lord with respect to a Pastor, to go in & out before us.--Bro. Nettles prayed & dismissed

The 8<sup>th</sup> of June being devoted to prayer & fasting, the Church thought proper to refer all business, which might have come before them, at this meeting to the next Saturday.--

Saturday 15<sup>th</sup>. June, met according to adjournment--Commenced with prayer and proceeded to the transaction of business.-
1.\*\* Agreed, hereafter[struck out], to have a Communion Season on the 5.\*\* Sabbath, in the present month:--The Exercises of the Season to commence the day before.--Upon this occasion also agreed to have a Charity Sermon preached, and to attend to the dedication of children.--

July 20<sup>th</sup> 1811--Met according to appointment for the purpose of transacting the business of the Church.--Rev. Davis Collins being present, preached a Sermon, after which proceeded to business.-

April 18<sup>th</sup> 1812 The Church convened for business Several Brethren absent. Agreed to have the Church doors opened every Sabbath at

11 O'Clock and requested that as many as can, should attend at that hour: also that two of the Sisters talk to Sister Brazington on the subject of her neglecting to attend our meetings

May 16<sup>th</sup> 1812. The Church met this day--Present, Brethren Rich.<sup>d</sup> Stratford. Jn<sup>o</sup> Miers, J[?] Knighten, W. Cook, Mary Cook. commenced with prayer by Bro. John Miers.

Agreed to [the?] all the members to attend the next Church Meeting; to be held on the  $20^{\,\mathrm{th}}$  June next.

July 4<sup>th</sup> 1812. The Church partly met but got divided. Some went to the lower Church. Nixon Lotay belonging to Doc Cox which was Babtized then adminestred the Sacrament in the afternoon dismis<sup>t</sup> till the 1<sup>st</sup> Sundy in August by Ingrum

August 1<sup>st</sup> 1812. The Church met M. Ingrum Prayed the members agreed to hold our Church meeting the first Saturday in October, January & April and so on until further Alteration Mr. Ingrum to meet us the first Lords day every month. Dismis<sup>t</sup>

August 9<sup>th</sup>1812. Rev. C. Ingrum appointed a meeting a Door opened for experiences M. Eccles offered and was recieved & Babtized at 2 0'Clock

Appointed a Meeting the 5<sup>th</sup> of September met accordingly on that day Brother Ingrum Preached at Sanderes Creek Several members from Bro. Ingrums Church present A Door opened for Experiences and for a trial with W. Brasington on fellowship W. Brasington gave full satisfaction to both Churches and was recieved. also Elisha Bell offered recieved and Babtized at Camden on Sunday Also a Negroe belonging to M. Champion offered received and was Baptized the next day at Camden Brother Brazington preached

January 2<sup>nd</sup> 1813. The Church convened this day took in Consideration the case of M. Vaughan negroe woman Bellar after Examination and proofs of adultry against her the Church unitedly agreed to cut her off by excumunication opened a Door for experiences a Black woman offered and was received belonging to B. Bineham by the name of Roze. Rev. C. Ingrum present Communed on Sunday the 3<sup>rd</sup> and Dismis.

June the 6<sup>th</sup> 1813. The Church met C Ingram & Jesse Pope present opened a door for experiences. Samuel Shiver and his wife Rachel offered and received & was Babtized in the evening Dismis. at the Water

<sup>1813</sup> July the 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> The Church having heard that it was reported that Brother W. Brazington was a frequent visitor of some bad House in Camden, Calls him before the Church to answer to the report, met according to appointment, our Brethren rev. Ingram, Knighten & Jesse Pope and S. Smith being present with us we proceeded to as follows,

he said that it was true for he had been there above a hundred times, but said that it was to drive his apprentices away. The Church told him he must be suspended untill his conduct could prove the purity of his Motives in going there, and he refusing to submit to the censure of the Church declaring that prejudice was the cause of their dealing with him and wishing to leave it, was allowed till next day to submit to the decision of the Church which he refused to do and was excommunicated on Sunday opened a Door for experiences rec<sup>d</sup> and Babtized two black persons after communion in the evening by the Rev<sup>d</sup> C Ingrum dismis<sup>t</sup> at the water

October 2. 1813. This being the return of our quaterly meeting, the Church convened for business. After a sermon was delivered by our rev. brother Jessie Pope from Hebrews "Let brotherly love continue," the church proceeded to transact the business. As brother Ingrem was absent in consequences of his having to attend the bethel Association, Resolved to postpone our communion season untill the 2. Sabbath in this Month: the exercises of the season to commence the day before.

Received brother Jesse Pope by letter of dismission from the church at the High Hills of Santee.

Appointed rev. brother Jesse Pope to write the letter to the Association; & him & brother Jonathan Mickle to represent us in that body

Accusations were made by brother Knighton against brother John Mires to the following effect viz. That he, Miers, at a certain time, joined in a combat with his sons and ordered them to fight, kill their opponents, & struck one of them because he would not fight and

that when brother Knigh[to]n went with other brethren to talk with him about it & about other misconduct of his sons, he, Miers had said, that brother Knighton was a liar, rogue & hypocrite. The Church took these things into consideration, & recievend no satisfaction from him, Miers, butpercieving the same spirit malice & anmity, agreed to try him under censure till he should give satisfaction

Brother Jesse Knighton was accused of intoxication, under the influence of which he had acted improperly: but acknowledging his his[struck out] fault, the Church admonished him, & advised him to form a resolution to drink no more spirituous liquors in public company, to which he agreed to the satisfaction of the Church.

January 1<sup>st</sup> 1814. This being the return of our quarterly meeting the Church convened Took in Consideration the Case of John Myers as being under a Censure of which he gave satisfaction & was restored by the Church-Also [took in Co struck out] Bellar(belonging to Wilie Vaughan) which was excommunicated has returned and gave satisfaction of her repentance and has the priveledge of the Church again--

--The Church agreed to Ordain Jesse Pope as a Minister of the Gospel, accordingly a meeting was appointed on the 15 & 16<sup>th</sup> Inst: Rev. John M Roberts C Ingrum George Pope Davis Collins & M. Good was present, accordingly he (Jesse Pope) was Ordained & Qualified for a Minister to preach and execute a Ministers office in any part of his Country.

Saturday 5 March 1814 This being the return of our quarterly meeting the church convened and proceeded to buisness as follows

Sister Bradley applied for aletter of dismission which was granted. The church appointed Bro. Cook and Bell to cite Sister Jackson and Bro. Campbell and his wife to attend our next church meeting and give account for their nonattendance of church meetings. Bro. Pope proposed to the church to form a missionary society, but none was formed. Dismissed by Payer-
Sabbath, March 6th 1814. Church convened Revd. J. Good delivered a sermon after which the Lord's supper was administered by Rev[d]

Bro. Js. Pope, Adjourned till 3 Oclock P. M. Met in the evening according to adjournment Revd & Bro Js. Pope Pronounced a sermon which closed our quarterly meeting--

Saturday June 4. 1814. Church convened to transact the buisness of our quarterly meeting and proceeded as follows. After a Sermon was delivered by Rev. J. M. Roberts the church waited to hear experiences but none made application, Bro. Brewer and his wife were received by letter. Bro Cook Said he had requested Br Campbell [and his wife struck out] and sister Jackson to attend this meeting [present struck out] he was reappointed to summon them to attend our next church meeting. Rev. & Bro. Js. Pope informed the Church that Sister Bradly who made application for a letter of dismission did not want the letter at present and he had not written it as appointed by the Church. The church appointed Sister Thornton and

sister Barrett to visit Sister Roads to know the reason of her nonattendance at our last and the present Church meeting together with several meetin of preaching. The church [appointed struck out] Set a part Bro. E. Bell to assist Bro. Cook in the office of a Deacon and requested Bro. Cook to inform him of the churc's appointment. <sup>--</sup>Sister Bradley attended and gave the Church Satisfaction for her non attendance--

<sup>--</sup>Appointed Rev. Js. Pope to write a letter to the Association and him with Bro. Bell and in Case of failure Br. Cook to represent them in that honorable body.

This being the return of our quarterly meeting December 4th 1814-The church meet, and after Sermon delivered by Rev & Bro' Pope
proceeded to transact buisness opened a way for experiences none
was received.

- -- Catherine Roads was excommunicated
- --Resolved That the declaration of the excommunication of a member be immediately after the voice of the Church is taken to exclude [a member struck out] the Same and not on the Sabbath or at any meeting after that day.--

The Church having been creditably informed that Bro. John Campbell had drank to excess Sundary times appointed Bro. E Bell to cite him to attend our next Church meeting.

The Church met according to appointment the 2nd Saturday in Jan. 18[15] and proceeded to buisness, as follows, Appointed Bro. Bell to request Bro J. Campbell to attend our next Church meeting and gives Satisfaction for intoxication--

--Harry belonging to Robert Mickle was excommunicated --

Saturday March 4th 1815. The Church met and proceeded, after Sermon Delivered by Rev. Joseph Nighton, to transact the following buisness. Put Bro. J. Campbell under Censure for repetedly being intoxicated---Bro. J. Mires acknowledged he had taken [too struck out] more Spiritous liquor than he ought though he had not been So drunk as to act amiss for which the Church admonished and forgave him--

Saturday April 8th 1815 The Church met according to appointment and Sermon delivered by  ${\rm Rev}^d$  & Bro. Pope proceeded to the following business, vis,

Took into consideration the case of Bro J. Campbell and he being absent laid it over till our ne[x]t meeting

--Bro. WM. Brasington was restored to the use of his gift.

Saturday June 3<sup>rd</sup> 1815. Thiz being the return of our quarterly meeting, the Church convened after Sermon deliverd by Rev. J. M. Roberts proceeded to buisness viz. Inquired for experiences, and recivied one Reved a free Black man a member of Church in Virginia. Took into consideration the case of Bro. J. Campell for intoxication and defered it till our next meeting. The High Hills Church transfered by the Hands of the Rev. J. M. Roberts, the Title of the Baptist meeting House in Camden to the incoporated Baptist Church in Camden.

This being the return of our quarterly meeting the Church met and after Sermon procounced by our Pastor proceeded to transact the following buisness. Viz: Excommunicated Bellah belonging to Wiley Vaughan Esq. for Adultery--

--Agreed that one Dollar be Sent for the Minutes--

Saturday December 2<sup>nd</sup> 1815

The B. Church of Christ at Camden to the Charleston B. Assocation Bretheren

Hitherto our letter have been little more than complaints of coldness & the hiding of Gods face from his people But it is our joy to day that though we have not had a great outpouring of the Spirit among us, yet, we have felt concerned for the prosperity of Zion, the conversion of sinners and have been able to keep up our little social meetings & feel a spirit of prayer & that the Lord has met us & blessed us in them; and as the brightest evidence, he has enabled us to rejoice over some souls who have been brought from Sin into the liberty of the glorious Gospel of peace—The work appears to have been the thorough work of God Silent yet powerful. During last winter Brother R Missildine accepted the pastoral Charge of our church & supplies us half of the time under who ministrations we trust we have been blessed. We are all in fellowship & love & at peace with one another

From Some difficulties that have come to our knowledge we have been led to Submit the following queries

1st Is there any & what authority in the New testament for forming branches to the church of Christ

2<sup>d</sup> When persons are found ready to submit to the ordinance of Baptism & too remote to attend any Church, is it not the duty of Such persons & of any Minister who may officiate in the neighborhood to endeavour to form a new & independent Church

In your next circular letter we would suggest the propriety of defining how far it is christian duty of involve themselves in debt for them selves or for others--

And it was answered in the affirmative by every member except Bro & Sister Blanding & Sister Eccles. When it was resolved that the brethren make it a matter of earnest prayer that their minds may be enlightened & their doubts removed

At a special Church Meeting were present Elder R Misseldine S. Blanding & J D Averill. Having heard that our Brother L. F. Breaker has been excluded from the communion table at Wateree Creek Church some time since & no information having been given us by that church, it is agreed that they be requested by letter to give us the facts which led to the exclusion that it may be bro't before this church in due form
