Death of Mrs. Borstel. On last Friday, after an illness of several weeks, Mrs. Cassandra H. Borstel departed this life, in the 47th year of her age. Mrs. Borstel came to this town in 1849 from Charleston, where her parents resided and entered in as a student in the Johnston Female Seminary, and in 1850 was married to Maj. F. C. V. Borstel, since which time, with the exception of one or two years during the war, she resided in Anderson. *Anderson Intelligencer.*

Married at the Hardeeville Baptist Church, on the evening of the 4th of April, 1876, by Rev. W. G. Rollins, Mr. C. B. Boyd and Miss F. E., eldest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Capers Lowry, all of Beaufort, S. C.

Govan Williams, son of Henry and Mrs. E. Williams, of Barnwell County, died on the 30th day of March 1876, aged 16 years. He had been a member of the Coalson's Branch Sunday school for five years. Thomas Clayton. Buford's Bridge, S. C.

Died, near Alston, S. C., on the 17th April last, Major Henry W. Parr, aged sixty-four years. He had been a member of the Little River church about thirty-three years... T. W. Smith.

Married on Sunday, 14th inst., at 10 o'clock A. M., at the residence of the bride's father, by the Rev. S. B. Wilkins, Mr. James S. Coker and Miss Lou P., daughter of Simeon Coker, all of Darlington County, S. C.

At the residence of the bride's father, on the 24th of Feb., 1876, by Rev. R. N. Terry, Mr. M. E. Terry and Miss S. M. Rentz, all of Colleton, S. C.

Col. Alexander I. Lawton who died in the 86th year of his age at the residence of his eldest son, Gen. A. R. Lawton, in Savannah, Georgia... 8th April 1876. Col. L. was born near Robertville, Beaufort County, South Carolina, where he resided all his life... represented his parish in the State Legislature. [eulogy and account]. J. A. L.

Departed this life, on the morning of the 12th inst., in the 48th year of her age, Mrs. Sarah Eugenia, wife of Michael Mixon, Esq., of St. Peter's Parish. The deceased had been an invalid for many years.... Robertville, May 19, 1876.

Issue of June 15, 1876

Died, May 30th, 1876, in Barnwell County, S. C., Miss Lucretia A. Peacock, aged about 42 years. A. B.

Mrs. Lucinda W. Lawton died suddenly at her residence in Lawtonville, S. C., on the 2d February 1876. Born in Edgefield County, on the 4th March 1803, of parents in prosperous circumstances.... Forty-eight years ago she married Rev. W. A. Lawton. [eulogy]

Issue of June 22, 1876

Departed this life, June 17, 1876, Mrs. Mary Jane Ross, aged 23 years, 1 months and 1 day. The deceased was a daughter of Dr. D. M. Breaker. She had been a member of the Baptist Church more than ten years, having been baptized by Rev. John Culpeper at Grimesville, in the fall of 1865.
