April 3rd 1824 - L.F. Breaker elected deacon

March 8th 1827 - Letter of dismissal

1828 - moved to Key West FL after daughter
1829 - name appears on list to Congress
1830 - Florida Census L.F. in Key West with 3 males & 3 females & 6 slaves, born P.C.

October 7th 1833 - L.F. bought a home in Key West for 350 dollars from Green
1835 - Name appears on list to Congress
1838 - F.C. 6th appointed as justice of the peace in Key West
1840 - L.F. in Key West with 4 males and 5 females (no slaves)
1840 - L.F. nominated for Port Warden in Key West, FL

1842 - dies

Feb 26th 1842 L.F. Breaker is appointed as Justice of the Peace in Key West, FL

Issue of May 11, 1842

Departed this life at Greenville, Miss, on the 15th March, Mrs. Mary Williams, formerly of Flat Rock, Kershaw District.

Issue of May 18, 1842

Departed this life at Key West, Fa., on the morning, of the 23d March, Mrs. Martha Breaker, consort of Mr. Lewis F. Breaker, formerly of this town. She was within one day of being 53 years old. for 30 years a consistent member of the Baptist Church... her son pursuing theological studies at the Furman Institution. (eulogy).

(Several errors appeared in the following article a few weeks ago). Died about noon on Sunday, April 10, 1842, Miss Mary Elizabeth, daughter of John J. Blair....

Issue of June 29, 1842

Died in this town on the 24th instant, Mrs. Elizabeth Jenkins, consort of the Rev. James Jenkins, in the 64th year of her age.... (eulogy).

On Saturday evening last, Frances Elizabeth, infant daughter of Capt. Joseph Baskin, of this place, aged 11 months and 5 days.

Issue of July 6, 1842

Departed this life on the 21st ult., at Winnsborough in the 30th year of her age, Mrs. Elizabeth Jenkins, consort of Joseph Jenkins, M. D. (eulogy).

Died in Benton county, Ala., on the 29th of May last, John Graham Esq. in the 57th year of his age. Mr. G. was born in N. Caroline, where he resided until about 6 years ago. He removed to Alabama where he remained till his death. In his death a bereaved widow and ten children have to mourn an irreparable loss. All his family (except his son a Baptist minister residing in Sumter District) reside near where he died... In 1829, he united himself with the Baptist Church, and was soon after chosen deacon.

On the 28th ult., David Solomon, infant son of Mr. John Brown, of this place, aged 5 months and 21 days.

Issue of August 24, 1842

Died at his residence Key West, Fa. in the 63d year of his age, on the 17th ult., after several weeks illness, Mr. Lewis F. Breaker, formerly a citizen of this place... a member of the Baptist Church and a Deacon.

Issue of August 31, 1842

Winnsborough, August 27th. Death of Col. Woodward. In this place on the 15th inst., of apoplexy, Col. William T. Woodward, in the 50th year of his age. Colonel Woodward was among the earliest graduates of the South Carolina College. He was the second son of Capt. John Woodward of the Revolution, who was the eldest son of Thos. Woodward, Chief of the Regulators....

True Carolinian.

Issue of September 21, 1842

Died at the house of his brother, in Sumterville, on Saturday the 21st ult., after a short illness, Mr. Thomas G. Miller, son of Col. Jno. B. Miller, in his 17th year, and for the previous six months a student of Mr. Hatfield's Academy in this place. (eulogy). Camden, 20th Sept. 1842.

At Hamburg, South Carolina, on the 11th inst., Col. Samuel Hammond, a Revolutionary Soldier.

Died at his residence, near Sumterville, on the 12th inst., after a short but severe illness, in the 27th year of his age, Col. William M. Miller, son of Col. John B. Miller. (long eulogy)

Issue of October 5, 1842

Married on the 28th ult., by the Rev. W. F. Brasington, Cap John D. Andrews, to Miss Elizabeth Reid, all of Lancaster District.

Died in Macon County, Al., on the 16th ult., Mrs. Sarah G. Pegues, relict of the late James H. Pegues of Chesterfield District in the 56th year of her age.

Issue of November 9, 1842

Departed this life on Tuesday evening, the 1st inst. very suddenly, of the croup, Louisa Billings, second daughter of Aaron and Elizabeth R. Burr, of this place, in the 5th year of her age.

Issue of November 16, 1842

The subject of this brief notice, Mrs. Ann Brown, wife of the late Mr. James Brown, departed this life on the 4th instant, aged 74 years. In middle life she experienced the renewing influence of the Holy Spirit, and lived an acceptable member of the Methodist Church in this place until her death. (eulogy)

Issue of November 23, 1842

Married at Rocky Mount, Fairfield District, on Tuesday evening the 8th inst. by the Rev. John Douglas, Mr. Robert Douglas, of Chester, to Miss Jane, daughter of Maj. James Barkley.

Issue of December 1, 1842

Married on Wednesday evening the 23d ult. by the Rev. Mr. Campbell, Dr. Edward A. Salmond, to Miss Ann Cante, daughter of H. R. Cook, Esq. all of this town.

On the 15th ultimo by the Rev'd Mr. Miller, Samuel B. Masse Esq. to Miss Mary Massey, both of Lancaster, S. C.

In Charlotte, N. C. on the 15th ult., by the Rev. Mr. Freeman. Joshua Trotter to Mrs. Wilkinson.

Departed this life on the 6th ult., Mrs. Ann Berry, consort of Rev. Thomas Berry, of this District, in the 60th year of her age. She had been for 42 years, a consistent member of the Methodist church.

Issue of January 11, 1843

Married on Wednesday evening, 28th of December last, by the Rev'd R. B. Campbell, Capt. Thomas E. Shannon, to Miss Elizabeth daughter of Capt. Benjamin Haile, all of this place.

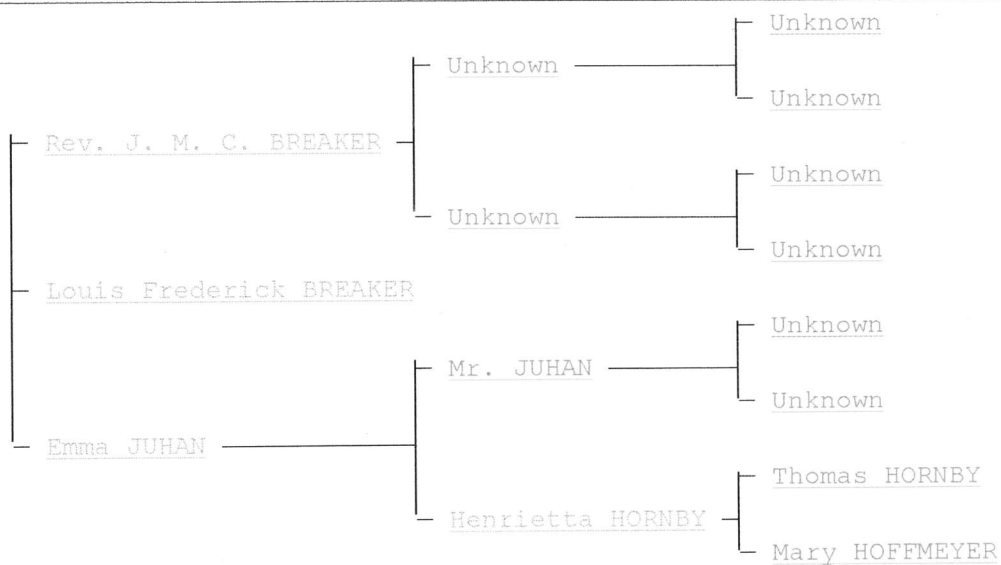
